- The CME conducted G. I. Summit in Della Resort, Lonavala. It was aimed to bring together well-known General Physician and Gastroenterologists on one platform and discuss their clinical experiences and expertise in the screening and treatment of Gastrointestinal conditions.
- CMEFI welcomed the forum and shared a few thoughts on the topics that were on the agenda.

• Management of Acute Pancreatitis- Dr. Roysuneel V. Patankar

Dr. Roysuneel V. Patankar has provided a comprehensive overview of the management of acute pancreatitis. He explained the importance of early diagnosis through clinical assessment and imaging techniques, such as abdominal CT scans and MRIs, to confirm the diagnosis and assess the severity. Dr. Patankar emphasized the need for immediate supportive care, including fluid resuscitation, pain management, and nutritional support to stabilize the patient.

He discussed the role of antibiotics in treating infected pancreatic necrosis and the criteria for surgical intervention, highlighting the benefits of minimally invasive techniques when necessary. Dr. Patankar also addressed the importance of identifying and managing underlying causes, such as gallstones or alcohol use, to prevent recurrence. He emphasized the need for a multidisciplinary approach involving gastroenterologists, surgeons, and critical care specialists to optimize patient outcomes.

Furthermore, Dr. Patankar highlighted the advancements in therapeutic endoscopy and interventional radiology that have improved the management of complications associated with acute pancreatitis. He concluded by stressing the importance of patient education on lifestyle modifications and follow-up care to ensure long-term recovery and prevent future episodes.

• Real-world challenges in the management of Acute Pancreatitis in Indians – Dr. Roysuneel V. Patankar

Dr. Roysuneel V. Patankar has provided an in-depth explanation of the real-world challenges in managing acute pancreatitis among Indian patients. He highlighted the delayed diagnosis often seen in rural areas due to limited access to advanced imaging and diagnostic facilities. Dr. Patankar discussed the high incidence of gallstone-related acute pancreatitis in India, emphasizing the need for improved surgical and endoscopic interventions. He also addressed the challenge of managing patients with severe pancreatitis who require intensive care, noting the scarcity of specialized critical care units equipped to handle such cases. Dr. Patankar highlighted the issues of affordability and accessibility, with many patients unable to afford the necessary treatments and follow-up care due to financial constraints.

Additionally, Dr. Patankar emphasized the importance of public health education to increase awareness about the early symptoms of acute pancreatitis and the significance of timely medical intervention. He discussed the impact of traditional dietary habits and alcohol consumption on the prevalence of pancreatitis, advocating for lifestyle modifications and preventive measures.

Finally, Dr. Patankar underscored the need for a multidisciplinary approach, involving gastroenterologists, surgeons, and critical care specialists, to address the complexities of acute pancreatitis management in the Indian context. He called for more research and better healthcare policies to improve patient outcomes and reduce the burden of this condition.

• Panel Discussion: Management of Acute Pancreatitis - Dr. Nilesh H. Doctor and Dr. Deepakkumar Gupta

During the panel discussion on the management of acute pancreatitis, Dr. Nilesh H. Doctor and Dr. Deepakkumar Gupta provided comprehensive insights into the topic.
